### Details of mock exam

Paper to be sat:	<b>Paper 1 - Fiction</b>
Topics to be covered in the mock:	<p><b>Section A: Reading (1 hour)</b></p> <p>Students are given an unseen extract taken from a 19<sup>th</sup> century text. They are then asked 4 questions on this text.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Q1 – This is a straightforward 'find the phrase in the text' question – 1 mark</li> <li>• Q2 – This is an 'inference' question – students are required to 'read between the lines' to find 2 words or phrases – 2 marks</li> <li>• Q3 - 'How does the writer use language and structure to create/give the reader the impression of...' - 6 marks (students must write at least x3 TEA(L) paragraphs – one of which must be about how <u>structure</u> is used in the passage.)</li> <li>• Q4 - 'Evaluate how successfully the writer has...' This is designed to assess the students' understanding of what makes the extract interesting and engaging – 15 marks (students are required to write 4/5 detailed P-E-E paragraphs)</li> </ul> <p><b>Section B – Writing (45 minutes)</b></p> <p>This section assesses the students' ability to write an imaginative narrative (story) - it is essential that they spend a very brief amount of time planning this before they begin writing. The students must either write about an image provided for them, <u>or</u> write about an event/scenario. They must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Structure the story carefully and/or imaginatively to engage a reader</li> <li>• Use paragraphs and sentences for conscious effect</li> <li>• Use an extensive vocabulary, particularly figurative devices (metaphor etc.)</li> <li>• Use a wide range of punctuation accurately</li> </ul>

Booklets contain a range of 19th C extracts with sample questions and imaginative writing tasks.</p> <p><u>Sample reading questions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How does the writer use language and structure to engage the reader?</li> <li>• In this extract the writer attempt to create tension/ a sense of mystery etc.</li> <li>• Evaluate how successfully this is achieved.</li> </ul> <p><u>Sample writing questions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write about a time you met somebody new.</li> <li>• Write about a time you felt challenged.</li> </ul>
