**BOTH YEARS** Queen Mary University of London has a number of **joint honour degree programmes** for students interested in **history, languages, and social sciences**. **BOTH YEARS** **Students interested in healthcare related courses:** the **NHS Bursary Scheme**, which previously paid the tuition fees for students doing health-related courses and helped with maintenance costs, will be **finishing for students in England this year**. This affects all students planning to apply for **health-related courses** (e.g. nursing, midwifery, nutrition, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, and the fifth year of medicine or dentistry degrees) **from 2017 entry onwards**. There are some **bursaries and grants** available for some students on some health-related courses, which will depend on the individual university or college. For health-related courses there is also the possibility of a 'Long Course Loan' as the total term times of these courses last longer than other degree courses due to placements. If students are considering applying for these courses it is worth researching the implications of the NHS Bursary Scheme ending; we will be placing factsheets for students on the Sixth Form Information Page on Moodle in the near future.
