BOTH YEARS Josh Rook, an ex-QEHS student, is coming in to talk to Sixth Form students on Monday 17 December (lunchtime, 12.50pm start) in A19. Josh studied a BSc in Economics and Business at the University of Amsterdam with a semester abroad at the University of Toronto, followed by an MSc in Economics at the University of Edinburgh. He currently works for the Government Economics Service, having joined the Civil Service via their Fast Stream scheme, and will be talking about his own experiences as well as the new Government Economic Service Degree Level Apprenticeship (see below). The talk is open to both Years 12 and 13 and would be of interest to any students thinking of studying abroad, studying economics and business, or undertaking a degree apprenticeship (even if you have already applied to universities via UCAS – see below for the benefits of a degree apprenticeship). Students can bring their lunch along to the session.

Careers/Apprenticeships

PEAR 13 Reminder: The Civil Service now offers the first degree-level economics apprenticeship programme in the UK: the Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship. Apprentices will work in a central government department or agency while studying a degree in economics with the University of Kent. Successful completion of the apprenticeship therefore offers four years' paid work experience in the Civil Service, a fully funded Economics degree with no student loans to pay, and a salary of at least £27,000 (after graduation).
