BOTH YEARS Oxford University is showing a live Mathematics Student Lecture on <u>Thursday 14</u> February 2019, 10–11am. Professor James Sparks will be delivering a first-year undergraduate lecture on Dynamics, the mathematics of how things change with time. Students can watch live and ask questions, and a real tutorial based on the lecture will also be filmed the following week. The lecture will remain available if you can't watch it live. YEAR 12 Oriel College at Oxford University is holding a **Year 12 Medicine Day** on <u>Saturday 16</u> <u>February 2019</u>. Designed for students considering Medicine courses at any university (**not just Oxford**), the day includes information on admissions tests, personal statements, work experience, and the student experience of medical school. There will also be interactive academic sessions with medical actors and doctors to replicate **real-life clinical teaching**, and the opportunity to talk to current students. The day is **free of charge** – students will need to **pay for their travel**, but there is potentially help from Oxford with these costs. The school must nominate students for a place, so interested students should **give their names to the Curriculum Office** by 2.30pm on Monday.

BOTH YEARS The Debate Chamber Summer Schools offer students the opportunity to study certain subjects at the level of first year university studies with a range of challenging topics covered in seminars, lectures, activities and informal discussions. Subjects offered include History, Classical Civilisations, English Literature, International Relations, Computer Science, Law, Art History, Medicine, Economics, Philosophy, Physics, Politics, and Dentistry. All the summer schools take place at University of London venues in Bloomsbury (please note students will need to arrange their own accommodation). There is limited bursary funding available. YEAR 12 Sutton Trust Summer Schools are free, all expenses paid, one-week residential programmes that provide Year 12 students a taste of life at university. The week consists not just of lectures, seminars, and tutorials, but also a varied programme of social activities to give an overall view of life as an undergraduate at a research-led university. Thirteen institutions currently take part in the Sutton Trust Summer Schools, including universities in Bristol, Cambridge, Durham, Edinburgh, London, Nottingham, St Andrews, and Warwick, and there are over 40 different subjects on offer. Priority will be given to students who meet certain eligibility criteria including first generation to attend university and household income. YEAR 12 Northumbria University run a **Supported Entry Scheme** called NU Entry for **Year 12 students**. By participating in the scheme, students will have the opportunity to develop skills necessary for successful undergraduate study. The programme also provides the chance to earn 'NU Entry points' which are **equivalent to UCAS Tariff Points** and can **contribute to applications** to Northumbria University undergraduate programmes. NU Entry students will receive **online mentoring** from current Northumbria University students throughout Year 13. It is worth noting that although there are **eligibility criteria** for the NU Entry scheme, it is broader than other similar schemes and takes into account home circumstances, with extenuating circumstances considered on an individual basis.
