YEAR 13 It is vital you spend time thoroughly checking your UCAS offers. Important points are:

- Make sure that the entry requirements for your insurance choice are lower than your firm choice.
- If you have received an **unconditional offer** it can have a time restraint, so make sure you check this carefully.
- If you haven't been on an **open day** to a university you are going to make your firm or insurance choice we strongly advise you visit ideally on a post-offer day.
- You should read the small print very carefully there can be **subtle differences** between offers that look similar.
- If you've used all five choices and you're not holding any offers, you can use UCAS Extra to add another choice from <u>25 February 2019</u> – see

YEAR 13 On Wednesday 13 February 2019 (2–3pm), there will be a **webinar on psychopathology** available to our students in school. Three universities will be presenting on different topics:

- The University of Sheffield will discuss how psychologists evaluate the effectiveness of treatments for anxiety, depression and addictions.
- Goldsmiths University will present 'Psychopathology: Psychosocial Views and Critique'.
- The University of East Anglia will discuss 'are serial killers born or made?'

Unfortunately this webinar is during Year 12 work experience, but interested Year 13 students should sign up with the Social Sciences department or the Curriculum Office by noon on <u>Monday 11</u> <u>February 2019</u>. Please note students **should not miss lessons** for the webinar.

YEAR 12 Northumbria University is running an Applied Science Taster Day on <u>Wednesday 5 June</u> 2019</u>. The day includes three workshops:

- 'How Fresh is Fresh?' (Chemistry): using thin-layer chromatography to determine which out of 'fresh' spinach or frozen spinach is freshest.
- Sugar Consumption (Food & Nutrition): investigating what happens to foods when they are made without sugar, and exploring the health impact on our bodies.
- Diabetes (Biological Sciences): learning the basic principles in diagnosing diabetes and a chance to try out the techniques and equipment needed to be a diabetes diagnostician.

The event is very popular and has limited spaces, so applications are made through the school. Interested students should give their name to Joanne in the Curriculum Office either in person or by email (curriculum@qehs.net) **BOTH YEARS** Open Doors 2019 is a scheme that gives students a unique chance to see behind the scenes at **major live construction sites** across England, discovering how the buildings and structures are constructed and finding out about the **diverse range of skills and professions** needed on site. One local project available to visit is the Mount Oswald project, a £80 million scheme for **Durham University** to develop new college and student facilities. Visits to the site, taking place throughout March 2019, will include a **guided tour** to see the work in action, and the opportunity to ask any questions about the project. This would be useful for students interested in **architecture, civil engineering, surveying, property development, or any other construction-related disciplines**.
