Careers/Apprenticeships

BOTH YEARS DNV GL Spadeadam Testing and Research, based in **Gilsland** near Brampton, has some apprenticeship vacancies available for **Year 11** and **Year 13** school leavers. They are coming into school on Monday 4 March 2019 to introduce students to their unique site, where they test products and processes which generally involve large-scale jet fires, explosions, vapour clouds, pool fires or other hazardous processes for oil and gas companies across the world including Shell and BP. Overall they have various apprenticeships available but they also offer the potential for **further study to degree level**. The lunchtime talk on Monday will be in A21 at 12.50pm; students can bring their lunches with them. The talk is open to all students from Years 11-13 – Year 11 and Year 13 students can find out about the opportunities available now, and Year 12 students can learn about the company and schemes available for future knowledge. YEAR 12 The University of Sheffield now offers a 'Pathway to Engineering' scheme for students who want to study engineering but did not take Physics at A Level. The Pathway is a three-week course that allows students to gain access to Mechanical Engineering, Aerospace Engineering and MEng Engineering without the need to do a Foundation Year. There is a cost for accommodation in the University halls of residence for the duration of the Pathway, although scholarships are available. After contacting the relevant department, students then apply through UCAS in the usual way and will be made an offer based on them attending the Pathway course. YEAR 12 Reminder: Northumbria University run a **Supported Entry Scheme** (NU Entry) for **Year 12 students**. By participating in the scheme, students will have the opportunity to **develop skills** necessary for successful undergraduate study. The programme also provides the chance to earn 'NU Entry points' which are **equivalent to UCAS Tariff Points** and can **contribute to applications** to Northumbria University undergraduate programmes.
