BOTH YEARS Eversheds are accepting applications for their 'Life as a Lawyer' event which will be held on Wednesday 27 March 2019 at their Newcastle office. The day features a number of workshops to give Sixth Form students an insight into the role of a lawyer, the work they may be involved in, and what it is like to work at Eversheds. There will also be an opportunity to meet and talk to a number of current Eversheds lawyers. There is a very quick turnaround with this event and there are only two places available for this event, so anyone interested should give their name to the Curriculum Office by Monday 11 March 2019.

YEAR 12 Northumbria University is running a new **Applied Science Taster Day** on <u>Wednesday 5 June 2019</u>. The day includes three workshops:

- 'How Fresh is Fresh?' (Chemistry): using thin-layer chromatography to determine which out of 'fresh' spinach or frozen spinach is freshest.
- Sugar Consumption (Food & Nutrition): investigating what happens to foods when they are made without sugar, and exploring the health impact on our bodies.
- Diabetes (Biological Sciences): learning the basic principles in diagnosing diabetes and a chance to try out the techniques and equipment needed to be a diabetes diagnostician.

YEAR 12 Year 12 students interested in studying languages at university have been invited to an event taking place at Ponteland High School on Friday 29 March 2019. Dr Charlotte Lee, a lecturer from Cambridge University's Faculty of Modern and Medieval Languages, will deliver a session using poetry in foreign languages followed by a talk about languages in higher education, university life, the admissions process and careers.
