YEAR 12 A number of universities are running two interactive webinars for Year 12 students interested in studying Nursing or Biosciences. The webinars will allow students to hear from a variety of universities about their courses and will show how the same course can be very different between universities, allowing students to start thinking about what they need to know or prioritise when making a decision about courses and locations.

YEAR 12 Chrysalis are a Hexham-based charity that runs a social activity club for those with dementia and their families. They are currently looking for volunteers from Year 12: they have identified social media as an area which needs to be developed, and are looking to complete an audit of activity for charities/businesses in their sector plus other similarly-sized local charities in different fields. The University of Birmingham runs a supported entry scheme for Year 12 students called the National Access Summer School programme. The scheme is only available to students who live outside the Greater West Midlands region and begins with a week-long residential at the University from 18 – 21 August 2019. Students who successfully complete the programme will receive special consideration from admissions tutors, and with a successful application will receive an offer of up to two A Level grades lower. These students will also be eligible for two special bursaries. The entry

scheme includes taster lectures, the opportunity to stay in halls of residence, UCAS applications support, and mentoring from current undergraduates. YEAR 12 Lancaster University is holding a Year 12 Sports and Exercise Science Taster Day on Thursday 13 June 2019. The day includes a campus tour, a course overview, and three taster sessions covering nutrition, biomechanics field-testing, and a demonstration of the sports and exercise physiology laboratory. The Taster Day would be particularly useful for A Level PE students and OCR Sport Science students who also take a science A Level.
