YEAR 12 The University of Leeds has a number of taster events coming up for students interested in the social sciences:

- Law Taster Day: <u>Tuesday 11 June 2019</u>. The event includes academic taster sessions, advice from the admissions department regarding legal-based personal statements, and the opportunity to talk to current Law students about their experiences.
- **Geography Taster Day**: <u>Thursday 13 June 2019</u>. The day includes a range of taster sessions and workshops relating to Physical Geography, Human Geography, Sustainability, Climate Change and Environmental Policy.
- Sociology and Social Policy Taster Day: <u>Tuesday 18 June 2019</u>. The day is designed to demonstrate what it is like to study BA Sociology, BA Social Policy, and related degree programmes through lectures and seminars.
- Social Science Conference: <u>Wednesday 3 July 2019</u>. The conference includes a number of workshops across different subject areas: Sociology, Education, Environment, Politics, Business, Economics, and more. Students will have the opportunity to learn from, ask questions of, and challenge academics and lecturers on the work they are doing.
- **Business Taster Day**: <u>Wednesday 10 July 2019</u>. The taster day includes interactive workshops related to accounting and finance, business management, economics, human resources, international business, and business analytics.

BOTH YEARS A webinar on **Biosciences Degrees**, featuring the **University of Glasgow and the University of Sheffield**, will be taking place on <u>Wednesday 8 May 2019</u> in the Curriculum Office. The webinar allows both universities to discuss their courses including requirements, format, and strengths of their Biosciences courses and facilities. Webinars such as these allow students to hear from a variety of universities without having to travel, and show how the same course can be very different between universities. YEAR 12 The **University of Bristol** is holding a **taster day** at St James' Park, Newcastle, on <u>Tuesday 18</u> June 2019 (9.30am – 3.00pm). The event is designed to provide an insight into what it would be like studying at Bristol, provide guidance on the application process, and allow students to attend taster academic sessions from a choice of subjects from one of three streams: STEM, Social Sciences & Law, and Arts & Humanities. The day also includes guidance on personal statements and UCAS, and the opportunity to talk to current University of Bristol students. YEAR 12 Northumbria University is holding a Geography Taster event on <u>Tuesday 2 July 2019</u>. The event is free and is open to all Year 12 students interested in studying Geography and/or Environmental Science at university. Depending on what area of Geography students are interested in (BSc Geography, BA Geography, Environmental Science or BA/BSc Geography), there will be different workshops and academic focuses, covering topics such as meteorology, ecology, mapping cities, geographical information systems, and microplastics in the environment.
