Successful completion of the programme results in a degree in Professional Policing Practice, with all tuition fees covered by Northumbria Police. **YEAR 12 Oxford University** is accepting applications for their new **supported entry scheme** for students in the North East: 'Aim for Oxford'. The **two-year programme** is free and will have 40

places available. Students will have the opportunity to attend enrichment, information and guidance sessions hosted at **Newcastle Sixth Form College**, followed by a four-night summer school at Oxford University in <u>August 2020</u>. There will then be a programme of support for students as they enter Year 13 and make their applications to Oxford. The main eligibility criteria for the scheme is academic (strong GCSE grades), but there are additional criteria that Oxford will consider, including postcode scores, eligibility for free school meals, first generation to go to university, and young carers. YEAR 13 Some universities require you to sit an admissions test as part of the application process. An increasing number of courses have additional application requirements, and it is students' responsibility to register for any additional testing and assessments as determined by their individual university courses. The application deadlines for the tests are approaching – it is important that students have read carefully through each university's requirements and organised themselves to meet these in good time. YEAR 13 The University of Leeds' supported entry scheme is called Access to Leeds. Eligible students receive an Access to Leeds offer up to two A level grades below the standard offer, subject to successful completion of the Access to Leeds online module which encompasses study skills and subject skills. The programme is designed to ease students' transition into university life and give them a head-start by providing access to the University's academics, IT facilities and resources before the course starts. Similarly, the University of Leeds has launched a new 'Gateway to Medicine' course, designed to allow students who might not meet the essential criteria for a medicine undergraduate course to enter the field of Medicine. During the first year of the course, students will refine their scientific understanding and develop their study skills. After successful completion of this Gateway year, students will progress to the full five-year Medicine and Surgery course. The eligibility criteria for the Gateway course are the same as Access to Leeds, plus predicted grades BBC at A Level including Chemistry or Biology at B grade. Applicants will also need to take the Bio-Medical Admissions Test (BMAT).
