Paper to be sat:	Paper 1: Shakespeare and Poetry
Topics to be covered in the mock:	<p>Section A: Shakespeare's <i>Macbeth</i> – compulsory question on an extract on Macbeth – tests students' ability to evaluate ideas/themes presented in the extract and analyse the impact of Shakespeare's use of language, form and structure. Also, longer response to a compulsory question on the whole text – ideas and themes.</p> <p>Section B: Relationship Anthology- one compulsory question on a set poem from the anthology that can be compared with another poem of the students' choice.</p> <p>Section C: Unseen poetry- one compulsory question on two unseen poems that can be compared in terms of theme, language and structure.</p>
