Paper to be sat:	Component 2 – UK Geographical landscapes
Topics to be covered in the mock:	<p>Section A: Topic 4 - The UK's evolving physical landscape including coastal change and conflict and River processes and pressures</p> <p>Section B: Topic 5 - The UK's evolving human landscape Case Study – Dynamic UK cities – Incl. Newcastle case study</p> <p>Section C: Topic 6 - Geographical investigation: <i>Fieldwork in a physical environment</i> - The exam paper will include two sets of questions, one on <i>Coastal change and conflict</i> and the other on River processes and pressures. Students <i>must</i> only answer the question on River processes and pressures and should ignore the coastal fieldwork question. They need to revise the Cockshaw Burn fieldwork study for this section.</p> <p><i>Fieldwork in a human environment</i> – The exam paper will include two sets of questions. One on Investigating dynamic inner cities and the other on <i>Investigating changing rural settlements</i>. Students should only answer the one on Investigating dynamic inner cities and should ignore the one on rural settlements. They need to revise their fieldwork study comparing quality of life in Benwell to Jesmond.</p> <p>STUDENTS WILL NEED TO BRING A CALCULATOR INTO THE EXAM WITH THEM.</p>

The annotations on their work will help them to identify areas they need to work on.</p>
Link to model answers or mark schemes:	<p>The revision cards provide multiple choice questions and answers as well as worked examples.</p>
Recommended revision guides:	<p>‘My Revision Notes’ by Hodder. These are available to buy from school along with the revision cards and work booklet for £15. Students will need to study pages 66-111 (excl. p108-109). Students will also have access to the Pearson online edition of the revision guide if they have bought the revision cards.</p>
In house booklets:	<p>Students have booklets for both fieldwork topics they have studied to help them revise.</p>
For essay subjects and longer answer questions – suggested question titles for practice:	<p>Students will have to answer 8 mark questions. These will most likely have the command work ‘assess’, The definition for this is “Use evidence to determine the relative significance of something. Give consideration to all factors and identify which are the most Important”. They need to structure their points in order of importance. A conclusion is not necessary if they have made a judgement throughout their answer.</p> <p>Kerboodle also has a number of practice 8-mark questions they can work through.</p>
