YEAR 12 Students interested in applying to Oxbridge: bookings are now being taken for the Oxford & Cambridge Student Conference. The event is held at St James' Park in Newcastle on <u>Tuesday 17</u> <u>March 2020</u>, and is designed to provide up-to-date information on the application and admissions process at Oxford and Cambridge, as well as providing an insight into student life. The conference includes course information sessions with taster lectures, and in-depth information on the application process, student finance and careers. There will also be the opportunity to talk to admissions tutors, academic staff, and current students. Bookings can only be made through the school, so students interested in attending the Conference should give their names to the Curriculum Office by Friday 17 January 2020.

YEAR 12 Durham University are accepting applications to their **Supported Progression** scheme for Year 12 students. The scheme is a **two-year programme of events and information**, including the opportunity to experience life as a Durham University student in residential events. Students who successfully complete the **assessed summer school** at the end of Year 12 will be recognised by Durham as having achieved a qualification equivalent to at least two grades at A level (or equivalent) that can **contribute toward entry at the University** for that subject if they apply in Year 13. YEAR 12 Cambridge University are hosting a two-and-a-half-day **residential programme** for Year 12 students interested in applying to study **Veterinary Medicine** at Cambridge on <u>6 – 8 April 2020</u>. The programme will include visits to the pre-clinical and clinical departments to give a taste of the undergraduate course. In addition, students will gain an insight into life at a Cambridge college, and have a chance to meet staff and current students. The recommendation from Cambridge is that students applying to the programme should be **A/A*-grade** candidates. The cost for the programme is **£240**, however there is a number of **bursaries** available to cover the course fee and travel costs. BOTH YEARS Northumberland National Park is looking for young people aged 16-25 to take part in their Spring Volunteer Placement. This opportunity is designed to give students who are interested in pursuing a career in the environmental/countryside sector the chance to sample working life with the Ranger team, with typical duties potentially including Public Right of Way work, maintenance work on the historic buildings and sites, assisting with guided walks, and work with specialist staff members such as ecologists, archaeologists, the farming team and the access officer.

There is also an additional opportunity to apply for a similar placement with the **Hadrian's Wall Path National Trail Ranger Team**. Successful applicants will be given training and development opportunities by working with the Hadrian's Wall Path (HWP) National Trail staff to undertake a range of access related tasks including surveying, practical maintenance projects, working with volunteers and engaging with the public.

Both placements run from <u>April to June</u>, and applicants will need to attend a **minimum of 10 days** during the three-month period. For more information, see
