VEAR 13 MI5 and MI6 are now accepting applications for their Cyber Apprenticeships based in London. The two-year apprenticeship covers cyber security, open source intelligence, network and digital communications theory, cryptography, and IT security. The UK Intelligence Agencies will support apprentices in completing the Cyber Security Technologist Level 4 Apprenticeship, as well as five other Level 4 certificates from the British Computing Society. Entry requirements are A Level (or equivalent) grades BBC (112 UCAS points), achieved or predicted. Applicants can be 17 years of age if they will turn 18 by 31 August 2020. YEAR 13 Year in Industry (YINI) is a gap year option for students interested in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects, ICT, and Business. The scheme offers the opportunity to gain paid work experience and skills that will benefit students during their further studies and into employment. YINI students make key contacts for the future with some students offered company sponsorship, paid holiday work and in some cases alternative routes into their chosen career, for example the offer of an apprenticeship. Previous QEHS students have undertaken Year in Industry placements and we have had very good feedback: they are well paid placements, an excellent experience before starting university, and look impressive on a CV! In the North East, there will be opportunities with Proctor & Gamble in their Newcastle base starting in September 2020. Students need to register at https://www.etrust.org.uk/yini-register, and YINI will then contact you to discuss what kind of placement you are looking for and will help you secure a placement. YEAR 12 Headstart, the programme for Year 12 students run by the organisation that also does the Year in Industry gap year scheme, will shortly be open for applications. Headstart provides hands-on Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) activities and taster courses for students who are interested in related courses but would like an opportunity to explore the subject areas further. Headstart courses take place at universities across the UK, giving further information on not just the degree courses available but also the varied career opportunities they'll lead to. As the courses cover a lot of niche areas across the STEM fields, Headstart offers a chance to sample a specialism that might not be available in Taster Sessions anywhere else, for example Marine Engineering, Nuclear Physics, Forensic Science, Creative Electronic Technologies, and Aerospace Engineering. There are potential bursaries available for students who meet eligibility criteria. The closing date for
