In house booklets:	Students will be given a range of critical material; students will be responsible for creating own revision flashcards and exploring context independently; here is an expectation that students will conduct individual research.
For essay subjects and longer answer questions – suggested question titles for practice:	 For Shakespeare's Othello (Section A): Please see suggested areas of study above. The examination question will open with a critical quotation stating a view about an aspect of love and/or relationships. This is designed to set up a debate. Students should be aware of how to respond to such a 'to what extent' or 'how far do you agree' style of question For Wuthering Heights/Poetry (Section C): Please see suggested areas of study above. The examination question requires a close comparison of the ideas and themes raised in the texts. Students should structure their answer clearly to find similarities and differences between the texts in relation to the themes and ideas suggested for revision. For both Section A and Section C, students will be provided with a guidance template/framework to help them structure their responses appropriately. This will be given to the students at least four weeks prior to their Year 12 examination to aid with the revision process.
