

DAILY TASKS:

1. <u>Vocabulary revision</u> using your homework booklets or the AQA full vocab list booklet which is on Moodle.

- Go through small sub-sections, marking the words that are STILL NOT SECURE (differentiate between the words you recognise for reading & listening, and those you can / cannot spell, for the writing exam)

- Make mind maps of vocab: this will also help you revise for the writing exam.

WEEKLY TASKS:

1. <u>Listening practice</u> from Kerboodle: use the online book pages to click on the sound files: just listen for comprehension. Alternatively, select the 'resources' tab, and choose a topic we have covered, where the activity is 'interactive'.

2. <u>Reading practice</u> from Kerboodle (and languages online): opt for any activities that are 'interactive' on topics that we have covered in class.

3. <u>Writing & Grammar practice</u>: practise writing 40 words in French, under the following headings:

- Ma famille et mes amis
- La technologie dans ma vie
- Mes loisirs
- Les fêtes
