# **English Literature Paper 2: A Christmas Carol and Poetry**

As you know, you will be required to work remotely for the foreseeable future. The English department would like you to access the school **Moodle English Literature folder** for detailed information about tasks that you should complete over the coming weeks.

In the Year 111 English Literature folder there will be dated sub-folders that contain tasks and activities. These will be updated approximately every fortnight to enable you to work through tasks at the rate we would normally expect for your age and ability.

The English department will require you to revise the following:

### **HOW TO REVISE:**

- 1. The format of this section of the exam is identical to Macbeth you will get an extract and then a longer answer on <u>a theme/idea</u> in the rest of the book.
- Revise how to write TEAL paragraphs for an extract. Ignorance and Want, The Ghost
  of Christmas Yet to Come have been extracts on past papers. The exam board seem
  to like setting examples from the start or end of Stave so I'd suggest looking closely
  at the descriptions of the Ghost of Christmas Past and Present.
- 3. Ensure you have a clear overview of the novel as a whole. The examination essay really wants you to track a theme through Stave One to Stave Five.

- Read through your 'A Christmas Carol' revision booklet and ensure that you know the key characters – their role and function and quotations associate with them. Make mindmaps, cue cards etc.

8. Remember – you MUST NOT refer to the extract in your essay. You are being asked about the theme elsewhere in the novel. There is an expectation that you can give an overview of the named theme elsewhere in the book. I would recommend referring to how the theme is presented in Stave One, another moment from the middle of the play and finally in Stave Five.

### **RELATIONSHIPS POETRY**

You have all been given a detailed revision booklet with everything you need to know about the poems – make notes from this and learn key aspects of HOW the writers/speakers present their ideas –how they use language, form and structure.

You also need to know a little context for each poem.

- You will be given a named poem to compare to a poem of your choice. The previous exam poems have been 'Valentine'; 'A Complaint' and 'She Walks in Beauty'. They seem to favour the shorter poems. Useful video on how to compare two poems:

- 2. Use the guidance at the front of your poetry booklet to group poems together e.g. unhappy relationships/ happy relationships, protective relationships/ loss of love etc.

### **UNSEEN POETRY**

Use the poetry anthology and try comparing poems from the other clusters in your Edexcel Anthology (e.g. Conflict and Time) by trying to find similarities and difference between them.

Write responses comparing any of the poems you have been previously given: **Woman Work and Overheard**, **Tramp and Decomposition**, **Cats, On aging etc.** Revise poetic techniques so you can identify them quickly in an exam situation.
