



## DAILY TASKS:

1. **Vocabulary revision** using the AQA full vocab list booklet.

- Go through small sections, marking the words that are still not SECURE (differentiate between the words you recognise for reading & listening, and those you can / cannot spell, for the writing exam).

- Make mind maps of vocab: this will also help you revise for the writing exam.

2. **Speaking card revision**: you will need to know ALL answers SECURELY by the time you do your exam which is currently in the week following Easter. Start to think about the topic you want to choose first for the general conversation; you will then be tested on one of the other 2 themes as the second conversation topic and the remaining one will be tested in the photo card section.

You MUST learn all 3 topics confidently.

## WEEKLY TASKS:

1. **A page of the Writing Practice booklet**, ensuring you include PA, PR, F, O X 2 and J X 2 for ALL 90 & 150 word tasks. VARY YOUR WRITING

2. **Reading practice from:**

a) Kerboodle: use the online book and interactive activities to complete a minimum of 2 reading activities per week.

b) Moodle: complete sections of the reading booklet and use the answers to check your responses.

3. **Listening practice from:**

a) Kerboodle: use the online book pages to click on the sound files: just listen for comprehension.

b) Moodle: there are a number of practice questions you can access in the year 11 'weekly listening' course.

4. **Past Paper practice from:**

Go to the AQA website and complete past papers for reading or listening.
