Edge Hill University are running a weekly timetable of online activities to provide information and support to students regarding Higher Education. The **University of Nottingham** has a large amount of electronic resources for students, covering higher education in general, the University itself, and individual subject areas. For example:

- The University's **School of Economics** has made a series of short videos providing an insight into the department, what an Economics degree entails and how the School's research can be understood in the real world.
- The **School of Geography** have an introductory course to statistics in Geography.
- The **School of Medical Sciences** have their own blog, and links to a video platform called Observe GP created by the Royal College of General Practitioners (launching 30 April).
- The Chemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, and Physics departments all have short videos exploring topics in their subject area.
- The **School of Social Sciences** is part of the UnBias project, an interdisciplinary research team along with the Universities of Oxford and Edinburgh. They have produced a number of tools to promote awareness about how algorithms shape online experiences.

The University of Leeds, in partnerships with the Nuffield Research Placement scheme, have summer placement opportunities available to Year 12 Social Science students. The research placements available cover topics such as politics on Twitter, mapping an LGBT+ monument for Leeds, variables bias in criminal sentencing, and measuring competition between private and public transport. The placements provide an opportunity to develop skills such as project management, critical thinking, and statistical skills, as well as the chance to work with undergraduate students and staff on live research projects. Successful students will need to undertake a week-long training course (now held online), and attend the four-week placement which will either be held in Leeds or online, depending on social distancing restrictions. On 29 April 2020 there will be a Classical Civilisation webinar, where two universities (University of East Anglia and University of Reading) will each have 30 minutes to deliver a topic-based 'micro' talk. The University of East Anglia will explore 'What is Knowledge? Ancient Answers to an Ancient Question', and the University of Reading will present '10 Things You Really Ought to Know About Democracy'. By hearing from two universities, students will also be able to see how the study of one subject (in this case Classical Civilisation) can vary between institutions. The webinar is suitable for Year 12 and Year 13 students with an interest in Classical Civilisation and related disciplines such as Philosophy, Archaeology, and Politics.
