YEAR 12 The **University Clinical Aptitude Test** (UCAT), used in the selection process by the majority of **UK University Medical and Dental Schools**, has announced a choice of sitting the UCAT either **online or at one of their test centres**. Registration for the UCAT will open on <u>1 July 2020</u> and testing will take place between <u>3 August and 1 October</u> ahead of the UCAS deadline of <u>15 October 2020</u>.
