## University/College

**BOTH YEARS** Newcastle University runs a supported entry scheme called the PARTNERS Programme. Through PARTNERS, eligible students could receive a lower offer (up to three grades lower) for a place on their undergraduate courses than the University's typical offer. In addition, the PARTNERS Team provides students with ongoing support to make informed choices about higher education, develop skills to be successful at university, and prepare for the transition from school to higher education. This year the team will host a series of online Q&A events that will provide an opportunity to chat to the PARTNERS team, PARTNERS students, and other members of staff from across the University such as Accommodation Services and Student Finance. Acceptance to the PARTNERS scheme requires students to fulfil certain eligibility criteria (e.g. one or more of postcode, entitlement to Free School Meals, first to go to university, in care/young carer, disabilities/long-term health conditions; the full list is available on the website) and successful completion of an Academic Summer School (provisional for 2021).

**YEAR 12** Oxford University is accepting applications for their new supported entry scheme for students in the North East: 'Aim for Oxford'. The two-year programme is free and has a limited number of places available. The programme aims to equip students with greater knowledge and understanding about the Oxbridge application process, as well as providing academic taster sessions delivered by Oxford staff during Year 12. The first year of the programme culminates in a four-night summer school at Oxford University in <u>August 2021</u>, where students work on their own mini research project. There will then be a programme of support for students as they enter Year 13 and make their applications to Oxford. The main eligibility criteria for the scheme is academic (strong GCSE grades), but there are additional criteria that Oxford will consider, including postcode scores, eligibility for free school meals, first generation to go to university, and young carers. **YEAR 13** Oxford for North East are also running admissions tests workshops free of charge to Year 13 state school students from the North East. All the material covered in the sessions will be delivered by current undergraduates, graduates, tutors, and members of Oxford staff. There will be five workshops overall:

- Thinking Skills and Philosophy workshop: Monday 12 October 2020
- BMAT/Medicine workshop: <u>Wednesday 14 October 2020</u>
- Physics/Maths workshop: Friday 16 October 2020
- Languages workshop: Monday 19 October 2020
- Humanities workshop: Wednesday 21 October 2020
