## Careers

YEAR 13 / SCHOOL LEAVERS Northumberland Honey has a vacancy for a Beekeeping/Bee Farming apprenticeship. A former QEHS student was the first apprenticeship that Northumberland Honey took on and the scheme worked so well that they're advertising for a second apprentice! The threeyear apprenticeship will be split between working bees in the summer and undertaking jobs in the workshop; renewing/building frames and beehive boxes; extracting, processing, jarring and labelling honey; and being involved in sparking mead production. The apprentice will join an experienced team of three, and will gain a diploma in excellence in bee farming. Applicants must be **over 18** to apply and have a full clean driving licence. **BOTH YEARS** The **Chartered Institute of Environmental Health** are hosting **an online careers fair** on <u>Saturday 17 October 2020</u>. **BOTH YEARS** The Army have set up a Virtual Careers Centre for any students looking for information about joining the Army, or the many varied careers that are available – combat, logistics and support, engineering, communications and intelligence, music, and many more! There is also a dedicated section to discuss the different routes into the Army, from university to apprenticeships. **BOTH YEARS** InvestIN Education runs a **Young Lawyer Programme** and a **Young Political Leader Programme**, this year held online. The two-day events provide an intensive introduction to each career and include activities such as:

- Young Lawyer Programme (<u>17 18 October 2020</u>): a live murder trial where students can cross-examine witnesses, a high-profile human rights case about the deportation of a terrorist, a multi-million-pound celebrity divorce case involving the custody of children, and corporate legal advice to a multi-billion-dollar tech company that wants to expand abroad.
- Young Political Leader Programme (<u>14 15 November 2020</u>): thinking like a UN Ambassador in a 'Model UN' General Assembly meeting, debating with former MPs in a simulated House of Commons debate, representing your constituency in a simulated Parliamentary Question Time, and acting as a UK diplomat advising the head of the Foreign Office.

**BOTH YEARS** Medical Projects are running an **online work experience course** called **'GP Live'** on various dates between <u>October 2020 and February 2021</u>. GP Live gives students the chance to **host their own GP surgery** under the guidance of mentors, taking actual patient histories, form diagnoses, order tests and scans and suggest treatment plans.
