**YEAR 13 Reminder:** This is the time of year that **universities/colleges** usually run an intensive programme of **open days**, offering students the chance to experience that institution before submitting UCAS applications. These events have now moved **online**, but institutions are working hard to provide a huge amount of information and insights to replicate what students would have experienced on a campus open day. It is worth noting that **it is possible to send your UCAS form off with two choices and then add your other three after you have researched other universities (as long as it's before <u>30 June 2021</u> and you have not accepted or declined your other offers), so open days do not need to delay the most important step of your application. **YEAR 12** Reminder: Oxford University is accepting applications for their new supported entry scheme for students in the North East: 'Aim for Oxford'. The two-year programme is free and has a limited number of places available. The programme aims to equip students with greater knowledge and understanding about the Oxbridge application process, as well as providing academic taster sessions delivered by Oxford staff during Year 12. The first year of the programme culminates in a four-night summer school at Oxford University in August 2021, where students work on their own

mini research project. There will then be a **programme of support** for students as they enter Year 13 and make their applications to Oxford. The main eligibility criteria for the scheme is academic (strong GCSE grades), but there are additional criteria that Oxford will consider, including postcode scores, eligibility for free school meals, first generation to go to university, and young carers. The deadline for applications is midnight on <u>11 October 2020</u>. Both Years Channel Talent is hosting an 'insight4me Politics' webinar on 11 November 2020 (2pm – 3pm). During insight4me webinars, two universities will deliver a topic-based 'micro' talk, providing an insight into the teaching of that topic at university while giving students the chance to talk to different universities and make informed comparisons about how Politics is taught in different institutions. The overall theme of the session will be 'Is the UK Parliament Fit for Purpose?' and the two universities present will be Goldsmiths, University of London, and University of East Anglia (UEA). BOTH YEARS There will also be an 'insight4me Linguistics' webinar on 15 October 2020 (12.45pm – 1.45pm). During the webinar, University of Nottingham and University of Reading will each have roughly 30 minutes to deliver their topic-based 'micro' talk within an overall session theme of Child Speech Development. The representatives from the universities will be:

- Dr Helen Buckler, Assistant Professor in Psycholinguistics and Second Language Acquisition from the University of Nottingham. Dr Buckler will discuss the earliest stages of language acquisition during the first year of a baby's life.
- Dr Fraibet Aveledo from the Department of English Language and Applied Linguistics at the University of Reading. Dr Aveledo will discuss how children start to expand their sentence repertoire and produce more complex syntactic structures.
