### Careers

**YEAR 13** The Civil Service will shortly be accepting applications for their specialist degree apprenticeship scheme and the only **degree-level economics apprenticeship** programme in the UK: the Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship. Apprentices will work in a **central government department or agency** while studying a **degree in economics** with the University of Kent. Successful completion of the apprenticeship therefore offers **four years' paid work experience** in the Civil Service, a **fully funded Economics degree** with no student loans to pay, and a **salary of at least £27,000** (after graduation). **YEAR 13** A number of companies are currently advertising their **apprenticeships and trainee positions**:

- **PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC)** are recruiting for their school leaver programmes and their 'Flying Start' degree programme that includes a fast track to becoming a Chartered Accountant and paid work experience with PwC every year.

- **IBM** are accepting applications for their gap year programmes – IBM Technology Futures Placement and IBM Business Futures Placement. The programme offers a year's paid internship (salary starting at £18,000), working in relevant areas across the company. - The **National Audit Office** are recruiting for their Chartered Accountancy Training Apprenticeship Scheme. The programme offers participants varied and wide-ranging work experience, the Chartered Accountancy qualification and membership to the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. Starting salary for apprentices is £18,000.

**BOTH YEARS** Teesside University have a number of **Science/Geography** related online taster sessions in December:

- **Environmental Science, Geography and Geology** (Tuesday 15 December 2020, 11am – noon). Peter Beveridge, the course leader for Earth Sciences at Teesside, will talk more about the subject areas of environmental science, geography and geology, and how a degree in these subjects can lead to rewarding careers.
- **Biomedical Sciences** (Tuesday 8 or Tuesday 15 December 2020, 1pm – 2pm). Working in partnership with clinicians and other healthcare professionals, biomedical scientists are at the forefront of the NHS and private healthcare services, undertaking a broad range of clinical laboratory investigations in cancer, toxicology, pathology, immunology and infectious disease control.
- **Computer Digital Forensics** (Tuesday 8 December 2020, 11am – noon). The session will provide an introduction to digital evidence and forensic investigations, exploring how experts in computer and digital forensics have a key role to play in investigating, preventing and detecting crime, and countering terrorist threats.

## University/College

**BOTH YEARS** Lancaster University are also now accepting applications to their **Lancaster Access Programme**. Open to both Year 12 and Year 13 students, the scheme is designed to help students **develop skills to help with their studies and enhance university applications**. Participants will have access to a dedicated online Lancaster University OpenLearning platform, including a range of workshops and activities that can be completed flexibly alongside school studies. Students will **earn credits** for each activity they complete. Successful completion of the programme earns eligibility for a **lower offer** (of up to a two A level grades lower or equivalent) to study at Lancaster University. **YEAR 12** The **Sutton Trust US Programme** is now open for applications. The programme is specially designed to give UK **Year 12 students a taste of life at an American university**, with Harvard, Yale and MIT examples of previous host campuses. It is **free** to take part in as all costs are covered by the Sutton Trust. The programme includes a **week-long visit** to the US, two virtual residentials, **support** from the Sutton Trust advisers on applications and financial aid, in-depth **admissions test preparation** and guidance for parents/carers. The Sutton Trust does have quite strict **eligibility criteria** looking at academic achievement, household income and similar conditions, so it is worth thoroughly researching the programme to be aware of these requirements.
