Careers

YEAR 13 Reminder: the Civil Service will shortly be accepting applications for their specialist degree apprenticeship scheme and the only **degree-level economics apprenticeship** programme in the UK: the **Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship**. Successful completion of the apprenticeship offers **four years' paid work experience** in the Civil Service, a **fully funded Economics degree** with no student loans to pay, and **a salary of at least £27,000** (after graduation). The Government Economic Service is holding a **webinar** on <u>Monday 14 December 2020</u> (4pm – 5pm) to provide more information on the programme, which opens for applications on the same day. YEAR 13 The **Year in Industry** (YINI) is a **gap year** option that gives students the opportunity to gain **first-hand knowledge and experience of working** within one of the following industries: Science (particularly Physics), Engineering, Technology/Electronics, Maths, Business, Finance, IT, HR, or Marketing. The scheme provides **paid work experience** and skills that will benefit students during their further studies and into employment. YINI students make key contacts for the future with some students offered **company sponsorship**, **paid holiday work** and in some cases alternative routes into their chosen career, for example **the offer of an apprenticeship**. BOTH YEARS Reminder: FutureLearn is a portal for a wide range of **free online courses** (Massive Open Online Courses – MOOCs) from top universities and specialist organisations from across the world. They can be accessed on mobile, tablet or desktop, to undertake at your own pace and in your own time. FutureLearn courses are a good example for UCAS statements or CVs of **independent learning** and using resources to explore **topics in further depth and at a higher level** outside of lessons. With

the huge range of courses on offer, it's also a good place to explore **different disciplines within subject areas**. Upcoming and currently running courses include:

BOTH YEARS The **Oxbridge Launchpad** is a non-profit organisation founded by two Oxbridge students in response to widening educational disparity caused by the Coronavirus pandemic. It aims to support students from state school backgrounds with the **information and confidence to make competitive applications to Oxford and Cambridge**. The platform includes a **1** – **1 mentoring scheme** (mentors are current Oxbridge students), which aims to provide guidance and support for Year 12 and Year 13 state school students as they navigate what can often feel like a daunting admissions process. It also includes an **academic enrichment section**, which seeks to provide Sixth Form students with material to engage with their subject outside of the school curriculum. YEAR 12 Durham University is now accepting applications to their **Supported Progression scheme**. The programme offers a range of support and opportunities for Year 12 students to find out more about Durham University, to help them make applications, and to sample academic sessions. Successful completion of the scheme offers benefits such as a **guaranteed lower offer to Durham** (typically two grades below); **key information, advice, and guidance** around the UCAS application process; the opportunity to receive **feedback on a project** in a chosen subject area; and the opportunity **to speak to current Durham students** about what undergraduate life is like. The Supported Progression scheme has **strict eligibility criteria**, including postcode, receipt of e.g. free school meals, or first generation to attend university.
