Oxford's Digital Access Awards

Oxford is aware that the switch to online events has not made them more accessible for everyone. They are therefore offering Digital Access Awards to students who have limited or no access to the equipment necessary to effectively take part in a Univ study day. Awards can include items such as noise-muffling earphones, computer tablets, or limited data packages depending on an individual student's needs.

Students who are eligible for such awards generally meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Currently/in the past six years received Free School Meals
- Receive the 16-18 Bursary Fund
- Are currently in/were previously in local authority care for more than three months

When applying for a place on a study day, students will be invited to express their interest in applying for a Digital Access Award. This will have no impact on their chances of being offered a place on the study day.

Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are; household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

If you think you might meet the criteria to be a candidate for Northumbria's widening participation scheme please see their message at the end of bulletin. It gives details of the imminent deadlines for applying to the scheme, as well as links to a video to find out more about the scheme.

Year 13 degree Apprenticeships

A fully funded <u>Degree Apprentice</u> position will allow students to work towards a career as a Dosimetrist in the <u>Radiotherapy Department</u> at Freeman Hospital, Newcastle. Whilst studying, students will be employed by Newcastle Upon Tyne Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and receive an attractive salary and benefits.

If you are an A level / BTEC student who has a keen interest in science, and you are expected to meet the entry requirements for the BSc Hons Healthcare Science (Radiotherapy Physics) degree delivered by University West of England (UWE) Bristol. **A-level subjects:** Grade C in a Science subject. Subjects that meet the Science requirement for this course are: Biology, Human Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Psychology. Applicants with other Science subjects who have a strong academic profile will be considered on an individual basis. **BTEC** - they are asking for a 6 unit qualification but you may be able to apply with a 4 unit qualification and evidence of further science from other A Levels such as PE and geography for example.

Attached to this email are the full details of the posts and how to apply, including a job description and person specification. If you are not sure if you meet the A Level (or equivalent) entry requirements, contact the university admissions or <u>Michele.Wilkinson@nhs.net</u> who is promoting the apprenticeship if you still would like more clarification. Students will need to be academically strong (able to achieve 128 UCAS points), able to work full-time whilst studying and must want to qualify and practice as a Solicitor. The deadline for applications is **Friday 14th May** and students must be available for an Assessment Centre on **Wednesday 9th June**. They advise that students who are not available for the Assessment Centre need not apply. Details of the apprenticeship can be found <u>here</u>. An information event will take place (virtually) on **Tuesday 4th May**. This event will allow students to receive an overview of the Solicitor Apprenticeship programme and hear from existing apprentices. Northumbria University – NU Entry Scheme

Our applications for this year's supported entry scheme, **NU Entry**, are closing soon, with the deadline for students to complete applications being **Friday 30th April at 17:00**. We thought it would be useful to highlight that **most students who have applied have so far only partly completed their applications.** Most students have completed part 1 of their application with part 2 still outstanding. **Part 2, the reflective piece, is a compulsory element and must be submitted by 17:00 on Friday 30th April, so students have just under two weeks left to complete these!**

With the deadline fast approaching, this **Thursday 22nd April at 17:00**, we are running an **online top tips and Q&A session to support students with completing part 2 of their NU entry application**. We will provide some top tips on getting started with the reflective piece, content, and structure and be on hand to answer any questions students may have.
