Year 12 Work Experience Work experience should be completed during holiday periods wherever possible to make the most of teaching next half-term. A request to attend work experience in school time should be kept to the absolute minimum number of days and would require a leave of absence form to be completed: https://www.gehs.net/index.php/attendance-and-absence/
However, it is unlikely that school will be able to authorise the absence in the next half-term, not because we don't value work experience but because there is not sufficient lead time for the necessary risk assessment and insurance checks to take place which are required for us to authorise it. To complete the necessary checks can take around 6 week for an in-county placement and 10 weeks for an out of county placement. Checks are carried out by Future Works. Students need to download and complete with their parents a Work Experience Placement Form: https://www.gehs.net/index.php/work-experience/

University: Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are: household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

Information from AIMS.Guide

AIMS.Guide (Access into Medical School Guide) is a group of Medical students committed to making medicine more accessible to everyone and helping those from every background get into medicine.

There are currently three main strands to what we do to help get people into medicine:

- <u>Mentoring scheme</u>: Applicants (mentees) will be matched with medical students (mentors) of similar backgrounds and will be enrolled in our mentoring scheme which will build transferable skills as well as allow those from WP backgrounds to build a network. We have a formal mentoring scheme for those entering year 12 in September but we will support anyone applying at any stage.
- <u>Guide to the application and blog posts from role models</u>: We publish <u>blog posts</u> from medical students and doctors of all backgrounds to show readers that those from widening participation backgrounds can succeed. We also publish <u>guides</u> on the application process. All content is available for free on our website and no account is required.
- <u>Admissions calculator</u>: We have developed a free tool that any direct school-leaver can use to simplify the application process. Users input their grades, admissions test scores, and social demographic information (including postcode, GCSE/A-level institutions, household income, refugee status etc.). The calculator will then sort UK medical schools by the user's eligibility, returning respective minimum entry requirements and highlighting any contextual adjustments offered (i.e. grade reductions).

How we can help:

- All resources we have are free for anyone to use. Please enjoy!
- Anyone who is entering Year 12 in September is eligible to enrol in our formal mentoring scheme. This is a 2year mentoring scheme where you will receive 1:1 support for every step of the application.
- Anyone who is not entering Year 12 in September, we will endeavour to support in any way we can. Please feel free to get in touch and we will work out how we can support you depending on the stage you are currently at.
