- If you are applying to university this year and you haven't already emailed your referee a copy of your draft personal statement please do so. If you need a reminder about what to include and how to structure your personal statement please follow this link [How to write a personal statement](#). A draft personal statement will help your referee to identify what is missing from your application and what could be improved. It will also provide them with further information to help inform your reference, alongside the paragraphs written by your teachers. Remember your first draft doesn't have to be perfect but it is essential to keep your application moving.
- Applications with a deadline of 15th October 2021 (Medicine, Vet Science, Dentistry & Oxford and Cambridge) will need to be prioritised. It is therefore important that you act quickly on any changes to your application suggested by your referee. For early applicants the online application form, including the personal statement and payment to UCAS, should be completed by the 29th September.
- **If you have decided to apply for a course with a deadline of the 15th October and not told anyone this please contact your referee urgently.**
- If you have decided over the summer that you would like to apply to university and know what you wish to apply for email Curriculum@QEHS.net.
- If you would like to apply to university this year but need help deciding between courses please email Curriculum@qehs.net to request an appointment with Rebecca and Michelle.
- If you would like to apply for higher level apprenticeships which start to recruit early and you need help targeting companies please email ssunderland@qehs.net (Sarah is an independent careers advisor linked to the school).

University Admissions Tests**Year 13**

A number of competitive universities and courses have an **admissions test** in addition to your A Levels as a requirement for the course. Some of these are sat under exam conditions **through school** but some are **independently run**. Please **check carefully** with your chosen universities. The tests that can be sat through school are listed in **Appendix I**.

To sit one of the tests through school, please complete the entry form (on our website at <https://www.qehs.net/index.php/2021/09/15/university-admissions-tests/>) and return it to exams@qehs.net by the deadline of **12 noon on 24 September 2021**. Ensure you read the Notice to Candidates and note the date of your test and the 9am start time (also on our website at the link above). The Exams office will email you to confirm the room your test will take place in before November.

If you need to sit one of the **independent tests** (such as the **UCAT**) please make sure that you know your deadlines and that you have booked your tests in time.

Applying to Cambridge?

Pre-interview assessments will take place on **3 and 4 November**. The school must register you for the pre-interview assessments – you cannot register yourself. If you have applied for Medicine or Computer Science at Cambridge, you must be registered for the relevant pre-interview assessments by **1 October**, so **please make sure we know if this applies to you**. For all other courses requiring a pre-interview assessment, the registration deadline is **15 October** – again, **please make sure we are aware**. [Visit the website for more information](#). University: Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are: household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

Free Medicine Event on Saturday 25th September

The Birmingham Widening Access to Medical Sciences society (BWAMS) at the University of Birmingham aims to encourage and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds in undertaking careers in medical sciences. They aim to inspire and inform students about a career in Medicine.

They are hosting their annual **DR.EAM Senior Conference** this year. The DR.EAM Senior Conference is a **free** outreach event aimed at **Year 13 students** who are considering a career in medicine. (See flyer in **Appendix 2**).

They will provide students with insight into life as both a medical student and doctor and advice on the next steps to prepare for an application. The day will consist of inspiring talks and panels made up of doctors and medical students from around the country. Opportunities for 16-18 year old students interested in a legal career

BVL is a 10 year old charity that works to improve social mobility in the legal profession. They organise projects to give opportunities to state school students to understand the legal profession and gain experience to put on their CVs and personal statements. Model Law Commission, 1st October, <https://www.bvl.org.uk/model-law-commission>

The Model Law Commission is a three-month long project that provides A-Level students with the chance to simulate the work of the Law Commission. Students are split into four groups, each tasked with the reform of one of the following areas of law: (1) Family, Trusts or Land Law; (2) Criminal Law; (3) Commercial and Common Law; and (4) Public Law.

From October to December, students undertake a five-stage process: research, formulating recommendations, consulting with their peers, reporting on their proposals and devising their legislation. Students will discuss law reform ideas with each other, their Group Leaders and legal professionals. In late November, individuals from the Law Commission will give a presentation to students, and advise on the difficulties in reforming the law and how to write a law reform report. The project concludes with a final event in which students make presentations to an audience of MPs, legal professionals and journalists in Parliament in December.

Aqeel H Noorali Essay Competition, 15th October, <https://www.bvl.org.uk/aqeel-h-noorali-essay-competition>

In partnership with 9 Gough Chambers, BVL runs a legal essay writing competition in memory of barrister, Aqeel H Noorali. The top prize is £1,000 and a mini-pupillage (ie, work experience in a barristers' chambers), and there are also cash prizes for runners up. Students must make an 800-1200 word argument agreeing or disagreeing with the following statement: "Considering the backlog of criminal cases is causing lengthy delays in criminal proceedings, the Government should pass legislation to reduce the size of juries to expedite the process."

This event presents students with a chance to learn about the fascinating field of music and entertainment law. Students will attend: a workshop on copyright law with Nick Eziefula (Partner at Simkins LLP); talks from Amy Urpi (Head of Legal at PRS for Music), Jess Welch (Associate at Simkins LLP) and Jonathan Aitken (General Counsel at PRS for Music); and speed networking sessions with the lawyers, where they will be able to ask them questions about their careers and how to get into music and entertainment law.
