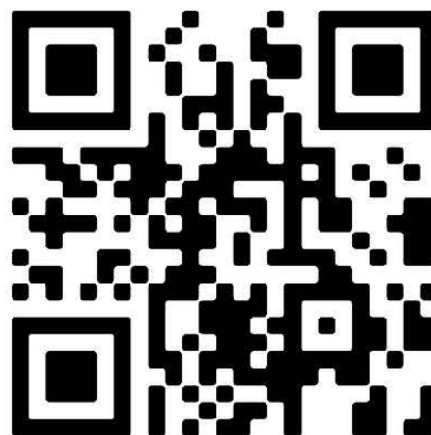

ALREADY HAVE A DEGREE?

Degree-holder entry programme (DHEP)

If you already have an undergraduate degree in any subject, you can join and follow this work-based programme. You'll be supported by off-the-job learning delivered by our training team and Northumbria University. This route normally takes two years, and the learning you'll undergo is recognised as a Diploma in Professional Policing. If you're looking for a job where every day is different, challenging and rewarding this could be the career path for you.

HAVE A DEGREE AND AN EYE FOR DETAIL?

Graduate Detective Programme (GDP)

Supported by off-job learning delivered by our training team you'll achieve a diploma in Professional Policing Practice alongside other detective focused work including the National Investigators exam.
