- Sets content and structure of courses;
- Organises lectures, seminars and lab work
- Sets and marks exams
- Awards degrees
- Provides student services such as counselling and careers



- Provide accommodation, meals, common rooms, sports and social facilities
- Provide pastoral care
- Organise tutorial teaching
- Offer students support of personal tutor

Personal Statement – 80%

WHY do you want to study this subject?

Why were you first drawn to the subject?

What questions do you have?

What particularly interests/excites you?

Relate this to your current studies





What EVIDENCE do you have?

Reading Relevant work experience TV/Radio/Podcasts Lectures Summer schools Taster days Essay competitions

What OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS do you have? (20%)

Not so important for Oxford and Cambridge, but can be for other universities

Use these things to demonstrate suitability for university study – focus on **transferable skills**



Selection Criteria

Look at course descriptions and selection criteria



PERSONAL QUALITIES

Students are selected on the basis of ability and potential in the following areas:

- O Reasoning ability; aptitude for analysing and solving problems using logical and critical approaches
- **O** Mathematical ability and potential
- O Independence and creativity of thought, lateral thinking and hypothesis generation
- O Capacity to absorb and use new ideas; ability to apply familiar ideas to unfamiliar situations
- Spirit of enquiry: keenness to understand the reasons for observations; depth; tendency to look for meaning; enthusiasm and curiosity in science
- O Observation: accurate, critical, quantitative
- O Appreciation of the field-based, laboratory and theoretical nature of the Earth Sciences



Criteria

The following criteria are to be applied in the assessment of candidates for History. In the case of candidates for the Joint Schools with History, these criteria are to be applied in assessment for the History side of each school.

- Intellectual curiosity
- Conceptual clarity
- Flexibility the capacity to engage with alternative perspectives and/or new information
- Accuracy and attention to detail
- Critical engagement
- Capacity for hard work
- Enthusiasm for History
- Evidence of historical imagination and understanding, in particular, the ability to speculate and compare, alongside the possession of appropriate historical knowledge and the capacity to deploy it.
