income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living
in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower
offer from the university.

Over the last year, a national programme called In2MedSchool has been created, which is a FREE
<b>MENTORING</b> initiative for students from widening participation backgrounds who want to/are thinking of
applying to study Medicine.
So for theme are 2,400 members all of which are dectars an medical students and ready to offer by members
So far, there are 2,400 mentors, all of which are doctors or medical students and ready to offer 1:1 mentoring sessions to Year 12 students. To date, they have <b>matched 1000 students</b> . In order to ensure the safety of
students, they have carried out DBS/PVG checks on all mentors. All of their mentors have agreed to follow the
Code of Conduct, which can be found on the website, <u>www.in2medschool.com</u> .

The application form above must be filled out <b>by the student</b> . It will ask you about what you intend to gain from
the programme and whether you fit their widening participation admission criteria. After submitting the form,
both you and your <b>parent/guardian will receive a permission slip</b> which must be returned to them before
you can be matched.
Whilst they primarily offer a mentoring service, they also run events open to all students who would like to learn
more about life as a doctor/medical student, tips and tricks, UCAT/BMAT/exam support and much

The criteria to be eligible are:
Must be a current Year 12 (S5) or Year 13 (S6) student
<ul> <li>Must be considering an application to Medicine</li> </ul>

- From a Widening Participation background Student applying to be a Mentee must fulfil at least one of the following:
- Neither parent has attended university
- Recipient of free school meals
- Have been in care
- Are a young carer
- Estranged from both parents or guardians
- Have a disability
- Are a forced migrant
- Are Black African or Black Caribbean
- Attended a non-selective state school for GCSE/A-level or SQA Highers/Advanced Higher
- Do not have a parent in a skilled profession
- Live in a neighbourhood with low progression to higher education (Please check POLAR/Acorn data)
- Speak English as a second language

Note: Please make sure that you are happy with the safety aspects of this should you be matched with a mentor.

## What are the Summer Schools?

Sutton Trust Summer schools offer students a week-long residential at one of their thirteen partner universities. Their Summer Schools increase confidence, raise aspirations and equip students with the necessary skills to navigate the Higher Education system. Upon completion of their programme, students also gain access to our outstanding alumni community.

All costs including travel, accommodation, food and activities are covered by the Trust and their partners which means it is completely **free of charge** for students to attend.

### What is the Apprenticeship Summer School?

The Apprenticeship Summer School is focused on building an understanding of degree apprenticeships, what they involve and whether a degree apprenticeship is the right choice. Students will hear from current apprentices, experience networking opportunities, attend sessions hosted by employers and learn the different application processes employers use.

#### How can students apply?

To apply for the programme, students must:

- Be in Year 12

- Have always attended a UK state-funded secondary school/college (non-fee-paying)
