### Chemistry

Dr Joseph Wright, Associate Professor in the School of Chemistry at University of East Anglia, will discuss moving away from fossil fuels and the nature and vital role of hydrogen gas in a more sustainable future.

Dr Tharin Blumenschein, Associate Professor in Biomolecular NMR Spectroscopy representing Society for Natural Sciences, will cover the basic physical principles of nuclear magnetic resonance (NMR) spectroscopy, the information that can be obtained using NMR spectroscopy, and how it is applied to biological molecules.

Finally, with a focus on organofluorine 'forever' chemicals, Professor Cris Halsall, Director of Natural Sciences at Lancaster University, will explore the interdisciplinary science used to understand chemicals used in certain pesticides and industrial chemicals that are very persistent in the environment and pose a health risk to humans and wildlife. Cris will also examine the role of interdisciplinary science to improve global chemical-use policy.

## Summer Preparation Programme - Lucy Cavendish College, Cambridge

The Summer Preparation Programme is designed to bridge the gap between GCSE (National 5/equivalent) and A-Level (IB/Scottish Highers and Advanced Highers/equivalent) study by providing students with a **month-long programme of academic enrichment tailored to their stage of the curriculum**. The programme will consist of study skills workshops on a range of important themes such as time management and essay writing, university readiness sessions to support **Year 11** students as they plan their next steps to top Universities like Cambridge, and substantive knowledge sessions, designed to supplement students' foundational academic knowledge so that they can hit the ground running when they start their post-16 studies.

The Summer Preparation Programme 2022 will build on the success and feedback of <u>last year's pilot programme</u>, following which 96% of students felt more confident about starting their post-16 studies:

- '[The SPP] really inspired me and gave me a huge boost of motivation and excitement for sixth form'
- '[The sessions] allowed me to see how subjects were studied at a higher, university-level which has really helped me understand what I need to do at A-Level to develop skills'
- "I have been able to have serious conversations about going to Oxbridge... what would initially seem a daunting experience has been made easy, accessible, and understandable."

The programme will take place entirely online and will run over the summer holidays for four weeks, from **Monday 8th August to Wednesday 31st August**. Following the Summer Preparation Programme, all students will be invited to participate in the Academic Enrichment Programme 2022/23, which will provide continuous academic support to students throughout Year 12.

These sustained programmes will give students the best chance of achieving their full potential.
