University: Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are: household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

Year 12 Attend Cambridge University Shadowing Scheme

The Shadowing Scheme is a free University Access Scheme that gives students the chance to visit Cambridge for three days, shadow a current undergraduate, go to lectures and social events, and receive advice from Cambridge Admissions Tutors.

- mature students or adult learners who are interested in applying later in life to university
