Recommended revision guides:	CGP GCSE geography. Edexcel B: Investigating Geographical Issues. These were offered to students to purchase at the start of year 10. We still have some left over to buy in the geography department for £6. They include both a revision guide and a workbook of practice questions.
For essay subjects and longer answer questions – suggested question titles for practice:	Students will have to answer 8 mark questions. These will most likely have the command work 'assess', The definition for this is "Use evidence to determine the relative significance of something. Give consideration to all factors and identify which are the most Important". They need to structure their points in order of importance. A conclusion is not necessary if they have made a judgement throughout their answer.
	If the question asks you to assess the role of something then you need to consider other factors which may also have played a role.
