Healthcare Science Virtual Work Experience Programme

This is a virtual work experience programme that you can complete at your own pace during half term, **24 October** – **4 November 2022** (around 10 hours). There are only 300 places nationally, so please apply asap. **Closing date** for applications is **19 October**.

During this programme you'll be introduced to the healthcare science professions. Once you're comfortable with the overall profession you'll explore more of the specific roles on offer and hear from the people who actually work those jobs on a daily basis. The programme will round off with an exploration of how to get career ready and some more insight into a career in the NHS.

To be eligible to take part in this programme you must:

Have expressed an interest in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) career and NOT medical or nursing through a short statement. In addition, you should identify with one of the following:

Is entitled to free school meals
Would be the first generation in their family to attend university
Family are in receipt of tax credits
Is or has been in care
Looked-after students
Forced migrant or asylum seeker or refugee

Pathways to the Professions Programme

Are you interested in Banking & Finance, Law, or Consulting (business and project management)? There are still places available on the Pathways to Professional fully virtual programmes (Pathways to Banking & Finance, Pathways to Law, and Pathways to Consulting) and Pathways to Law and Pathways to Medicine inperson programmes.

Newcastle University which offer in-person Pathways to Law and Pathways to Medicine programmes **still have open spaces**.
