In PSHE next Thursday, we are also offering a talk by Newcastle University on their Geographic Information Science degree. They give preference to students who have studied maths, science related subjects or geography in Sixth Form. It is a very practical degree that will give accreditation from both the Chartered Institute of Surveyors and the Chartered Institute of Civil Engineers. The course asks for BBB or equivalent at A Level but for students from our school who are eligible for the Newcastle University Partners Programme, the grade requirements would be CCC.

Politics: Engaging in Political Debate - Skills & Insight - UEA - 23 November

Beth Derks-van Damme from the School of Politics, Philosophy, Language and Communication Studies at UEA will firstly consider the channels through which young people can influence Politics before exploring the skills and techniques that can be employed to ensure arguments are heard. In particular, Beth will focus on the presentation of oral and written arguments and how to anticipate and address counter arguments.

Beth has a wealth of experience in mentoring young people to instigate positive societal change and, while offering insight into how to maximise influence at different levels of Politics, this session will be particularly beneficial in supporting current coursework and giving confidence in communication abilities.

Drama/Theatre: Set Design – UEA - December 5

Dr Paul Geary is a lecturer in Drama at UEA whose practice based research encompasses performance philosophy, live art and experimental performance through to socio-economic diversity in the creative industries. On 5th December, Paul will run a set design practical session exploring Designing Multisensory Performance Worlds. The session encourages students to consider set design with respect to the senses and artistically creating immersive and participatory performances, where the audience are 'bodily and sensorially inhabiting the world of the performance'. Paul has provided a 15 minute scene setting video to get students thinking about different concepts and opportunities in advance before exploring how to put these ideas into design practice in the live event.

Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

The Sutton Trust US Programme – Applications Now Open

The Sutton Trust US Programme is a once in a lifetime opportunity to explore what studying in the US is like. It will give you a taste of what it's like being an international student in the US and help you see if it could be the right fit for you. It's a fully-funded programme so all costs will be covered, including travel, residential events accommodation and food.

Eligible applicants must:

- Currently be in Year 12 in England and Wales, S5 in Scotland or Year 13 in Northern Ireland
- Attend, and have always attended, a state-funded school or college i.e. non-fee paying
- Not hold US citizenship
- Be from a low or middle income family (generally, this will mean a household earning £45,000 or less)
- Be interested in US culture and higher education
- Meet vaccination requirements to be able to enter the United States on a student visa if they decide to pursue an undergraduate degree in the USA.
