Free Opportunity – ORA Singers Young Composers' Scheme

The award-winning vocal group, ORA Singers, has launched its fourth national Young Composers' programme. This is a **free** scheme aimed at developing the skills of young composers from UK state schools. The programme sees ten Young Composers each receive 10 hours of one-to-one mentoring with professional composers, who will help them write a new choral piece which will be performed and recorded in concert by ORA Singers. During the scheme, Young Composers have their ideas and sketches workshopped by ORA Singers, who offer specialised tips and advice along with a guest composer.

The 2023 Young Composers scheme will also see up to 40 Apprentices fast-track their skills in composition through a series of online, in-depth workshops, and will gain invaluable insight into the world of professional composition by hearing from industry experts.
