Year 12 Residential Insight into University

Insight into University residential courses (previously known as Headstart) are summer schools run over 4 or 5 days where students get a taster of university life and an insight into a specific STEM subject. Students will get the opportunity to experience university style lectures and work on activities and group projects with the support of academics and student mentors.

Students will stay in halls of residence and will take part in social activities in the evenings. These courses are for Year 12 students and are a great way to try out a STEM subject at university before applying. This allows students to make a better informed decision for their UCAS application, as well as meeting like-minded students from all over the UK. These summer schools are run for small groups (on average 30 students) and so places are limited.

Year 13 Medicine and Dentistry Lecture Series – King's College, London

This programme is for students who are interested in becoming a doctor or dentist. Over the course of the 14 lecture programme students will hear from a variety of speakers to help them make the best application to medicine or dentistry possible. Last year's lectures included the following:

- Medical and dental specialities: cardiology, prosthodontics, renal transplant, and many more!
- Q&As each week with current medical and dental students as well as a lecture dedicated to the student experience.
- A session on other careers in healthcare with six professionals currently working and teaching in the sector (nursing, dietetics, clinical science, etc.)
- September Q&A with key admissions colleagues in the schools of medicine and dentistry at KCL and UCL.
- Lectures on the application process: the UCAT, personal statements, and interviews.

Lectures will be held on Tuesday evenings at 6-7.15pm and will run in blocks of three throughout 2023. The first three lectures will take place on the 31 January, 7 February, and 14 February. The remaining three blocks of lectures will take place in Spring and Summer.

The North East Solicitor Apprenticeship (NESA) Programme was created and began in 2017, providing an opportunity for those seeking to qualify as a solicitor to kickstart a legal career with a law firm or organisation's inhouse legal team whilst studying a Higher Apprenticeship (which leads to a Level 7 qualification) at Northumbria University. Solicitor Apprentices, selected through an assessment and interview process, undertake a six-year fully paid training scheme combining relevant and legal-focused training and education.

At the <u>NESA</u> Information Event, you will find out about the Programme, the apprenticeship opportunities provided by the participant law firms and organisations and the selection process. Current Apprentices will also provide an insight into their experience of the <u>NESA</u> Programme.

Civil & Structural Inspector Apprentice

Commencing in September 2023, the role includes attendance on a University Course, the Civil Engineer Apprentice Framework (Degree Level 6). This is anticipated to be by day release. Your apprenticeship will last 66 months (plus a 6-month end point assessment).

As an Apprentice Civil and Structural Inspector, you will be working with the Civil and Structural Inspectors to ensure that the Nexus Metro Infrastructure Civil and Structural assets remain safe to operate a Metro service across the North East. This shall include identifying and structural defects to assets and specifying repairs.

You must hold a minimum of five GCSEs (including English and maths, at grade C/grade 4 or above); and 112 UCAS points (grades AAA, AAC in A Levels - excludes general studies)
