

### Key Stage 4 (11)

In key stage 4, PSHE is taught as part of a carousel so students will not all be taught the course in the order set out below.

Deepening knowledge and understanding, extending and rehearsing skills, and further exploring attitudes, values and attributes acquired during KS 3. PSHE reflects the fact that students are moving towards an independent role in adult life, taking on greater responsibility for themselves and others.
