Thank you for indicating whether your child will or won't be attending on the relevant strike days following the recent communication sent to year groups. If you are a year 9 or 10 parent who hasn't yet let us know your intentions, please do so as soon as convenient using this <u>link</u>.

- **Year 11** students attending on the strike days should report to LA7. Those not attending should use the time to revise for the summer examinations.
- Year 9 students attending on Wednesday 15 March should report to the main hall at 8.45am. They should bring PE kit.
- Year 10 students attending on Thursday 16 March should report to the main hall at 8.45am. They should bring PE kit.
- Year 9 and 10 students working at home will be set activities for English, maths, biology, chemistry and physics via ClassCharts these will be made available each morning.
- Arrangements for year 12 and 13 students are as they were for previous strike days.

QEHS Green Team Initiative – Plea for unwanted spectacles!

Students from QEHS Green Team are launching an initiative to collect unused, unwanted spectacles to send in bulk to Specsavers for recycling.

Countless pairs of discarded spectacles lie unused in cupboards inside many people's homes. Most spectacles are not biodegradable and are a contributor to landfill globally. It can be difficult to find somewhere to recycle spectacles. However, Specsavers have a partnership with MyGroup to recycle spectacles – and their cases – free of charge. Their components are separated and the materials recycled to make more useful objects.
