Application deadline: Friday 31st March

The <u>In2science summer programme</u> is a free programme for current Year 12, S5 (or equivalent) students from low-income and disadvantaged backgrounds. The programme consists of an in-person work experience placement in a STEM subject, live online workshops, competitions and events. By taking part in the programme, students gain hands-on experience working with leading scientists, researchers and STEM professionals, and expand their personal and professional skills.

After participating in our 2022 summer programme:

- 87% of students reported feeling more confident
- 86% of students reported that the programme made them more sure of their career aspirations
- 72% of students felt confident they could write a high quality UCAS application
