For essay subjects and longer answer questions – suggested question titles for practice:	<ul> <li>Students will have to answer 8 mark questions. These will most likely have the command word 'assess', The definition for this is "Use evidence to determine the relative significance of something.</li> <li>Give consideration to all factors and identify which are the most Important". You need to structure your points in order of importance. E.g. 'The most important/significant factor is</li> <li>A conclusion is not necessary if you have made a judgement throughout your answer.</li> <li>If the question asks you to assess the role of something then you need to consider other factors which may also have played a role.</li> </ul>
