## **Uniform & Jewellery**

It has been lovely to see our students returning in the new QEHS blue uniform this term. In advance of next week, I just wanted to remind parents/carers and students about our uniform expectations. All students should wear:

A blue QEHS v-neck sweatshirt

A QEHS tie

A white collared shirt

Grey school trousers, shorts or a pleated school skirt. Sport-type shorts or leggings are not permitted.

All black polishable shoes

Our full uniform policy is available on the website.

Students may wear a maximum of two stud earrings. Bracelets, rings, nose piercings and all other jewellery is not permitted. Clear retainers may be worn but must be removed for PE along with all other jewellery.

False nails are not permitted.

# **Virtual Work Experience**

Last term our Y11 students participated in virtual work experience. As part of the exercise they had to develop a recruitment plan for a local employer, who set them the brief. The employer then returned to listen to their advice. We received this email from the NHS representative:

We really enjoyed doing the Work Experience event with Queen Elizabeth High School in July. I thought I would email to let you know that we have taken the feedback from the students onboard. The key messages we picked up from the recruitment strategies the students came up with were:

- Use social media such as TikTok and YouTube to promote our vacancies.
- Better promote the benefits of working for us
- Highlight the relatively low qualification requirement for the positions

I have just gone out to advert for 3 different apprentice vacancies – Facilities (Catering, Cleaning and Portering), Joinery and Painting and Decorating, and we have developed an advert taking the feedback into account.

The NHS wanted to feedback to the students how effectively they communicated their ideas.

### **Extracurricular Fair**

On Monday morning Y9-11 students will attend our extracurricular fair, where they have the chance to sign up to clubs and activities. Research shows that students who engage in the wider life of the school are happier, healthier and more successful.
