## **Social Mobility Foundation**

For Parents/Carers & Students

Each year we promote the Social Mobility Foundation, who aim to help students overcome any socio-economic barriers they might face when aiming for a professional career. The scheme support students through: **mentoring**, **work experience**, **university application support** and **skills workshops**. Their support starts in Year 12 and carries on right through to graduate employment.

A representative from the foundation will to come into school to explain a little about the two schemes they offer on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September, 12:30 to 1pm. If you are in receipt of free school meals and your GCSE grades look strong enough to be eligible for one of the programmes on offer, you will be invited to attend the short introductory session. Lunch will be provided.

In the introduction they will:

- Explain eligibility criteria to new Year 12 students
- Give an overview of support and opportunities on offer
- Explain the application process.

To be eligible for our programmes, every young person must:

- have completed their GCSEs at a non-selective state school
- be studying for their A levels or Highers at a non-selective state school
- be in the first year of their A level studies
- meet the academic requirements for the programmes, based on their GCSEs

If young people meet the above, they then must meet one of the criteria in option A, or two in option B:

Option A	Option B
Be care experienced	Be in the first generation of their family to attend university
Be in receipt of free school meals	Have a household income of £45,000 or lower
	Their highest earning parent is in a low or middle skilled job, or is unemployed

There are two levels of programme which have different academic criteria:

- Have achieved at least 4 x grade 7s (or above) for the Aspire Programme
- Have achieved at least 4 x grade 5s (or above) for the Reach Programme

## Geography: Global Commons with Glasgow & UEA - 9 October

On 9th October we are delighted to welcome Chris Philo, Professor in the School of Geographical and Earth Sciences at University of Glasgow, and Neil Ward, Professor in the School of Environmental Sciences at University of East Anglia, to discuss The Global Commons.

Chris will begin by introducing the concept of 'the commons', discussing its historical roots and threats and referencing the experience in Britain and its former colonies. Chris will move on to look at what happens when people start to be denied access to common resources.

Neil will then consider the food system and the global commons, talking about how countries are committing to protect the commons through the Paris Agreement, with a particular focus on the food system and using the UK as an example to show the scale of change that this would mean in practice.

## What will the apprentice be doing?

# **NHS Healthcare Careers Virtual Work Experience**

Follow multiple patients over a 6-month period, as they go from their initial injury to recovery. It is amazing how many different healthcare professionals are involved in a patient's care. This incredible opportunity showcases a variety of professionals in one day. It gives students a chance to see them in action in various settings from the ward to the community. It is also a fantastic opportunity to see them work together in a multidisciplinary team.

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and their healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community. For this reason we recommend that students attend one work experience a month for 6 months to not only gain a deeper knowledge of multidisciplinary teams in general but also their chosen careers.
