Peter C (Y13) was awarded Best in School and has qualified for the prestigious British Maths Olympiad Round 1. This is a 3.5 hour test to be held in November.

### MMR / Measles

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. Education settings are being asked by the Department for Education to share key messages from the NHS about MMR / measles to encourage parents to get their children vaccinated. Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.
