Our school has been listed as the 2nd best school in the North East and the highest placed school in Northumberland. In terms of the national rankings QE has moved to 239 (up 20 places) to break into the top 250 state schools. The Times highlighted that two thirds of QEHS A Level grades in 2023 were A*-B. This ranking reflects the hard work of staff and students in achieving excellent exam results but also recognises our commitment to achievement for all students and the vast offer that is in place to succeed in sport, music and other activities.

News from the community

The one-way system in Hexham is to be temporarily lifted from Saturday 2nd December so that traffic arrangements can return to normal during the Christmas trading period. The one-way system will be re-instated by Monday 8thJanuary 2024 to enable the final phase of work to take place, focused on the north side of the street, and this is likely to remain until early Spring 2024. Once the scheme is complete the affected area will return to two-way traffic with no permanent change to highway arrangements.
