Paper to be sat:	Paper 1 – Listening, reading and writing (100 marks, 50% of A level) Paper 2 – Writing (20% of A level)
Topics to be covered in the mock:	<p>Paper 1:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Aspects of Hispanic society Artistic culture in the Hispanic world Multiculturalism in Hispanic society Aspects of political life in Hispanic society Grammar <p>Listening section Listening and responding to spoken passages from a range of contexts and sources covering different registers and adapted as necessary. Material will include complex factual and abstract content and questions will target main points, gist and detail. Studio recordings will be used and students will have individual control of the recording. All questions are in Spanish, to be answered in Spanish (30 marks)</p> <p>Reading section Reading and responding to a variety of texts written for different purposes, drawn from a range of authentic sources and adapted as necessary. Material will include complex factual and abstract content and questions will target main points, gist and detail. All questions are in Spanish, to be answered in Spanish (30 marks)</p> <p>Writing section Translation into English; a passage of minimum 100 words (10 marks). Translation into Spanish; a passage of minimum 100 words (10 marks).</p> <p>Paper 2: Answer one question requiring a critical response in Spanish on the set text (<i>Como Agua Para Chocolate</i>) from a choice of two questions (40 marks). Answer one question requiring a critical response in Spanish on the set film (<i>Volver</i>) from a choice of two questions (40 marks).</p> <p>Students are advised to write approximately 300 words per essay.</p>
