Most lessons include the practice of all four skills, in addition to which students will be exposed to GCSE criteria such as role play scenarios, photo cards, reading and listening comprehensions and short written tasks. Students will be encouraged to use different verb forms and tenses and develop their ability to give opinions and justifications in their work, and to learn vocabulary week by week. Assessment opportunities test reading and listening skills as well as the application of grammar.
