Biology student success

We were delighted to find out that a group of Y12 Biologists have won "Highly Commended" for their entry into the first round of the Cambridge Biology Challenge, run by Homerton College. Amelie, Ellen, Freya, Charlotte C, and Rachel H independently organised themselves and submitted their entry to the question "Why don't animals have wheels?". This is an example of a question that might be asked at a Cambridge interview. Over 400 teams from schools across the UK took part, so highly commended is an amazing achievement. Well done!

Behaviour update

The vast majority of students at QEHS demonstrate excellent behaviour. Unfortunately, there is a minority of students who struggle to maintain punctuality throughout the school week. Time out of lessons is lost learning time so we need to work to combat this.

From Monday 26th February we are implementing the following changes:

Form time attendance

Form time begins at 8.45am. This is valuable time to support students' personal growth and wellbeing. If students are late into form time, they will receive an S3 detention. This will replace the detentions currently issued for being late into school. If students take a bus to school and it is late, they will receive a slip to hand to their form tutor which means that they will not be sanctioned.

Lesson punctuality

Students will no longer receive a late mark if they are late to a lesson. Staff will instead record the number of minutes a student is late to their lesson. At the end of each week, Year Teams will run a report to total minutes late for each student across the week. Students will serve a Leadership Late Detention on Friday after school to the nearest half hour of how many minutes late they have been across the week. Any students who accrue more than two hours of late minutes will serve a day in seclusion plus a one hour detention during the following week.

These detentions will be mandatory and failure to attend will result in seclusion. If transport home is an issue, please contact your child's head of year and we will work to support a solution.

As a part of your child's education at Queen Elizabeth High School we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. During the course of the year, your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) aspect of this programme. Students will also have opportunities to ask questions.

Online safety updates

Snapchat - New Parental Controls

In April 2023 Snapchat introduced My AI, essentially a chatbot. There was no choice, it was an embedded feature, and whilst many users are reporting a positive or mixed experience there have been some significant concerns over the advice being given to younger users (see HERE and HERE and HERE for examples).

Last week Snapchat expanded their Family Centre tools which, amongst other features, allows parents to restrict the ability for My AI to respond to chats. Further details of these new features can be found HERE.
