Quantum Physics - Nottingham & Surrey - 27 February

We will hear from Dr Lisa Morrison from University of Surrey who will discuss Quantum Physics and the Colour of Light. Lisa will explore how quantum mechanics has re-shaped our understanding of light to have an ongoing impact in science, technology, and engineering today.

Developing this theme, we are then joined by Professor Mark Fromhold from University of Nottingham who will look at Quantum Physics and New Technologies. Mark considers a new wave of "quantum 2.0" technologies, including revolutionary brain scanners, which work by harnessing the quantum waves either of atoms or of electrons inside atoms.
